EPISODE 27: HOW TO LEAD A STRONG FINAL OVERNIGHT

FRIDAY NIGHT

On Friday night we talk about the unique wiring that God has assigned to each of us, thinking in terms of our “strengths” or natural tendencies.

THIS SESSION WILL BE A SUCCESS IF:

- We laugh a lot at each other’s idiosyncrasies!
- We learn something about how God has wired us and how that can be leveraged in making disciples in our homes, our church, and our city.
- We are set free from feeling like failures if we are unable to be all things to all people in all situations.

PREP

Complete the Strengths Finder assessment and email/message your results to the Leader so they can compile them for the group. Read through the descriptors in the book for each of your strengths.

Based on how our Father has wired you:

- Where do you see potential for success/joy in your marriage, home, and disciple-making ministry?

- Where do you see potential for failure/frustration in your marriage, home, and disciple-making ministry?

WORD FOR FRIDAY NIGHT

Read and reflect on Luke 7:36-50.

This is the story of the “woman of the city” who washes Jesus’ feet in response to his grace. This is the posture from which we want all ministry to flow from at Seven Mile Road. And this is the work what we are praying Jesus would do in the hearts of as many Bostonian women as possible.

SATURDAY MORNING

On Saturday morning we celebrate God’s grace to us as we reflect on what’s we’ve learned and experienced during the track.

THIS SESION WILL BE A SUCCESS IF:

- We connect the dots on what we have learned about gospel-centered femininity to what it looks like to partner in advancing the gospel in the life of the church.
- We slow down and affirm one other and give thanks to God for His care and good intentions for us.

PREP

Think on the year and be prepared to share on the following questions:

- Are there areas that the Spirit has instructed or healed you in this year?
- What areas of repentance & belief that have been surfaced?
- What fears have surfaced?
- What areas may you be called/equipped to move towards?

WORD

1. Read and reflect on Romans 16:1-16.
2. Read and reflect on I Timothy 2:8-13 and 5:9-10.
3. Read and reflect on I Corinthians 11:2-16

Each of these texts - in their own distinct and helpful way – must inform our understanding of what it looks for women to engage in gospel work in the context of Jesus’ church. There are others, but we’ll focus on these.

READING

Read a portion of [Todd Murphy on Deaconesses](#) beginning near the end with the section called “Gender and the Diaconate.” Note the highlighted sections.

OPTIONAL READING

Read [Calvin’s Institutes Book 3 Chapter 3 Sections 1-3 only](#). We read this with our Ox Track to help convey a sense of the dignity of the office of elder. Reading this will help you get a feel for the gravity of the work you’d be assisting their pastors/elders in.

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
